At no time must professional dissent detract from ensuring that the child is safeguarded. This procedure provides information on how to resolve professional disagreements that may occur when:	When a child dies, in any circumstances, it is important for parents and families to understand what has happened and whether there are any lessons to be learned.
• A referral is not considered to meet eligibility criteria for assessment or service provision.	The purpose of a review and/or analysis is to identify any matters relating to the death, or deaths, that are relevant to the welfare of children in the area or to public health and safety, and to consider whether action should be taken in relation to any matters identified. If child death review partners find action should be taken by a person or organisation, they must inform them.
• There is disagreement as to whether child protection procedures should be initiated.
