COVID-19: Virtual Learning

Hampshire Safeguarding Children Partnership (HSCP) is excited to launch the 2022/23 offer for its Virtual Multi-Agency Learning Platform. Since its inception, the online training has grown substantially, with over 5,550 Hampshire delegates participating in Webinar Wednesdays during the 2021/22 training year. Feedback received has highlighted high delegate satisfaction, with the accessibility of training and subject knowledge of the trainers.

Courses are provided free of charge to all professionals working with families and children who live in the Hampshire Local Authority area.

What courses do you offer?

HSCP offers a wide variety of fully-funded multi-agency events, including virtual courses, webinars, workshops and e-learning materials. These events bring professionals together to develop knowledge and skills and emphasise the benefits of working together to deliver positive outcomes for children and families.

How can I book on HSCP training?

Courses are available to browse and book on the <u>HSCP Events Booking Page.</u> Each member of staff wishing to attend multi-agency safeguarding training must hold an account. New accounts can be set up on the <u>Registration</u> section of the Events Booking Page. Please note that you cannot book multiple tickets for the same course or book on another person's behalf; an individual account needs to be created for each person that is attending the training.

TRAINING PROGRAMME

All organisations working with children and families are responsible for ensuring that their staff and volunteers are confident and competent in carrying out their responsibilities for safeguarding children.

Staff should have access to appropriate development opportunities to ensure they have the knowledge and skills to identify and respond to abuse and neglect. HSCP will hold agencies to account in their efforts to ensure that all staff and volunteers working with children and/or their parents/carers are trained in safeguarding to an appropriate level.

HSCP commissions and delivers multi-agency events to complement in-house training.

Staff should determine, with their line manager, the courses best suited to their role or those which they are required to attend.

Multi-agency Safeguarding Events

Multi-agency training supports professionals in developing a shared understanding of decision making in respect of safeguarding children. Multi-agency events bring professionals together to develop knowledge and skills, emphasising the benefits of working together to deliver positive outcomes for children and families.
