What is Private Fostering?

- When a child under the age of 16 (under 18 if disabled) is cared for by someone who is not their parent or a 'close relative'.
- A private arrangement made between a parent and a carer, with the intention of lasting for 28 days or more.

If a private fostering arrangement is made, there is a <u>legal obligation</u> on carers and parents to notify the local authority.

Who could be a Private Foster Carer?

- Extended family such as a cousin or great aunt.
- Friends of the family.
- Parents of a friend of the child.
- Someone previously unknown to the child's family who is willing to privately foster a child.

How do I notify Hampshire Children's Services?

If you are told or made aware of a possible private fostering arrangement you must notify Children's Services:

- Professionals should complete the <u>Inter Agency Referral Form</u> (IARF)
- Members of the public can telephone 0300 555 1384 or email <u>childrens.services@hants.gov.uk</u>

Children's Services will need to be sure that the child is safe, healthy and happy and can offer support to private foster carers and parents where needed.
